

WALK-IN FREEZER/FREEZER WALLS/UPRIGHT FREEZER

Tools Needed

- Disposable Gloves
- Utility Bucket
- Deck Brush
- Non-Abrasive Blue Scrub Pad
- Blue Dry Mop Head
- Blue Mop Bucket and Wringer
- Clean Blue Towel
- Blue Broom and Blue Dustpan

Product Needed

DCT Freezer Cleaner



FREQUENCY OF CLEANING: Monthly.

SPECIAL DIRECTIONS FOR THIS TASK: Wear disposable gloves due to cold conditions when cleaning the freezer walls.

WALK-IN FREEZER FLOORS

STEP 1

- Empty racks by moving all food products to other shelving units within freezer.
- Move racks to one side, away from floor areas to be cleaned.

CAUTION: If racks are not on wheels, get assistance to move racks.

STEP 2

- Sweep entire floor to remove debris.
- Discard debris in trash container.

STEP 3

- Freezer floor cleaner will not remove heavy build-up of ice without manual intervention.

STEP 4

- Pour DCT Freezer Cleaner directly on floor area to be cleaned.

NOTE: Only pour enough product to clean roughly a 4' x 4' area at a time to facilitate ease of cleaning.

STEP 5

- Work DCT Freezer Cleaner onto floor with a deck brush and allow product to stand for 10-20 minutes.

STEP 6

- Repeat Step 4 and 5 in next area to be cleaned while allowing cleaner contact time in previously cleaned area.

STEP 7

- Scrub previously cleaned area again with deck brush.

NOTE: For stubborn buildup, use a non-abrasive blue pad to remove.

STEP 8

- Using a blue dry mop, pick up freezer floor cleaner from floor.

NOTE: The reason for a blue dry mop head is that any water in mop head will freeze.

- Wring excess freezer cleaner from mop into empty blue mop bucket as needed.

SPOT CLEANING/FREEZER WALLS

STEP 1

- Fill clean utility bucket 1/2 full with 1/2 gallon of DCT Freezer Cleaner from bottle.

STEP 2

NOTE: Put on disposable gloves due to the cold conditions.

- Dip non-abrasive blue scrub pad into DCT Freezer Cleaner, scrub areas to be cleaned.
- Using a dry, clean blue towel, wipe surface until freezer cleaner is removed.

NOTE: Ensure that blue towel is dry. Any water on towel will cause it to freeze.

- Wring excess freezer cleaner from towel into utility bucket as needed.

STEP 3

- Discard excess product, clean and put away utility buckets or pans.

NOTE: Make sure to clean out any mop heads or towels thoroughly prior to putting them away.

STEP 4

- If used, remove and discard disposable gloves.
- Wash hands before returning to service area
