

# SPRAY BUFF

## Tools Needed

- Wet Floor Sign
- Trigger Sprayer & Bottle
- 175+ RPM Floor Machine
- Floor Pads
- Dust Mop



## Product Needed

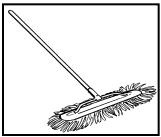
P&G Pro Line  
Spray Buff / Maintainer



**FREQUENCY OF CLEANING:** Bi-weekly or as needed to repair surface imperfections that cannot be repaired with daily maintenance procedures.

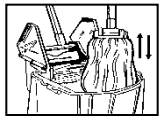
**PREPARATION:** Collect all tools, equipment and products required. Ensure all equipment is operational. Review MSDS, product labels and caution statements. Choose appropriate safety equipment.

**SPECIAL DIRECTIONS FOR THIS TASK:** Floor must be completely dry before performing this procedure. When finished, clean and return equipment to storage area. Remove wet floor sign only when surface is thoroughly dry.



### STEP 1

- Remove grit and loose soil by following the Dust Mop Procedure.



### STEP 2

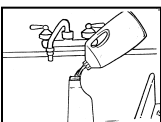
- Wet clean floor using one of the following procedures: Damp Mop Procedure, Disinfecting Damp Mop Procedure or Automatic Scrubber Floor Cleaning Procedure.



### STEP 3

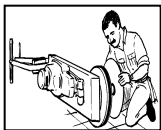
- Put out wet floor sign in area to be mopped.

**NOTE:** Floors must be completely dry before spray buffing.



### STEP 4

- Pour Spray Buff / Maintainer into spray bottle.



### STEP 5

- Mount **red** floor pad to machine.
- Lightly spray product on pad to pre-moisten.



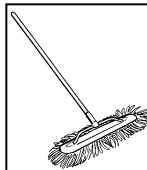
### STEP 6

- Starting at farthest point from door, spray solution lightly ( 2 – 3 full sprays ) ahead of pad.
- Spread product in 3 ft. by 3 ft. area with buffer using a left to right / right to left motion, overlapping each pass.
- Return and machine buff to deep gloss.
- Move to next 3 ft. by 3 ft. area, working towards doorway and repeat Step 6.



**NOTE:** Keep floor machine moving while buffing. Running machine in same spot can leave deep swirls in the finish.

**NOTE:** Flip or change pads as needed. When flipping or changing pads, lightly spray pad with Spray Buff / Maintainer to pre-moisten.



### STEP 7

- Dust mop area to remove loose residue left by pad following the Dust Mop Procedure.
