



Tide Stain Removal Treatment

Rewash/Soaker Powder

Machine Stain Aid Treatment and Soaker

General Information:

Tide Stain Removal Treatment is a powdered laundry detergent designed to remove stains not removed in a normal wash cycle – or for stained items that have been collected prior to an initial wash.

- Formulated to remove stains and soil from fabric
- Specially formulated for high efficiency front loading machines to control suds
- No chlorine bleach – safe to use on colored garments
- Non corrosive – safe for all employees to use.

Directions for use as a machine stain aid:

- Product should be used for a full load of collected items to be rewashed.
- Product can safely be added to the wash-wheel before the washer is loaded or it can be added through the manual detergent port.

Usage as a Machine Aid (One box contains 11.0 ounces (312 grams) of product):

- One box for a 35-65 pound capacity machine
- Two boxes for a 70 – 125 pound capacity machine
- Three boxes for a 125 – 175 pound capacity machine
- For greater than 200 pound capacity machine; use one box for each 50 pounds capacity
- Use about 1/3 of a box for a standard size top loading machine

Note: Soft water or under-filled loads causes for more suds than normal operation. In these situations reduce the dosing to start. If okay, follow directions above.

Liquid Dosing:

To maximize performance, liquid Tide should be turned off on the rewash cycle when using Tide Stain Removal Treatment. It can be used in addition to liquid Tide until the local distributor representative or a qualified P&G professional can reprogram the controller.

- Liquid Bleach should not be used if colored items are to be reclaimed.
- For bleachable items, liquid bleach should be added at 5.1 ounces per 50 lb. machine capacity in a separate (following) wash bath.

Machine Programming:

- Whites: 20 minute (hot/high) wash cycle, 1-2 minute rinse (or spin-rinse), 20 minute bleach cycle (hot/low)
- Colors: 30 minute (warm or hot if possible/high) wash cycle
- Whites and Colors rinse sequence: 2 minute bath (warm/high), 2 minute bath (warm/high), Intermediate extraction (or spin rinse), 2 minute bath (warm/high), 4 minute final rinse with Downy (warm or cold/low).

For use as a soak aid:

- Add one box per 20 gallons of water. Water should be as hot as suitable for the garments to be soaked
- Mix until dissolved
- Add items to be soaked
- Soak for 1 to 24 hours
- Wash in normal or rewash cycle

Note: absorbed detergent will come into the wash machine with the soaked fabrics. Do not over dose a cycle that contains soaked items.
